**He was almost an hour late.**

Past simple - opowiadam o wydarzeniu

**He was complaining all the time.**

Past continuous - all the time

**I'm definitely not going to invite him.**

Be going to - brak zamiaru

**Are you and Mike coming over on Friday?**

Present continuous - plan

**beat the holiday blues**

**Lately you have been working your fingers to the bone.**

Present perfect continuous - przedział

**It is high time you got some rest.**

Past simple - high time

**There are a lot of things going on right now.**

Present continuous - right now

**Do you see all these papers?**

Present simple - see, stan

**idiomy:**

**beat the holiday blues**

**work sb's fingers to the bone**

**It has been years!**

Present perfect - przedział

**What are you doing at Christmas?**

Present continuous - plan

**I admire your mother for taking on such a challenge.**

Present simple - admire

**It's been the 1th Christmas since your dad died.**

Present perfect - since
